Message from Headteacher

First of all, I would like to give a warm welcome to our new families. I had the pleasure of attending the Friends of Highfield coffee morning and it was great to see so many new faces as well as some more familiar ones. The children have quickly settled into their new classes and have thoroughly enjoyed being back at school with their friends and new teachers.

Our theme for the term is 'Get up, stand up!'. This comes from the song that Bob Marley wrote after seeing the poverty in Haiti. This is linked to this term's value of **courage** and the 'Show Racism the red **card'** event that will be taking place later in the term. These themes will be linked to our curriculum and children have already created lovely displays on the topic.

We continue to focus on hands on, creative learning and our Year 5s have already visited Winchmore school for a creative writing session. Children have told us some of their favourite lessons are when they work practically and creatively and we are ensuring that they get plenty of opportunities to do so.

Another focus is using technology to enhance children's learning experiences and Year 3 have already been using the Nearpod app in their lesson starters. Over the year children will be given the opportunity to showcase their work, produce videos and program robots, amongst many other things. Learning still needs to be a collaborative, hands on experience and it is important we prepare our children for the world they will be living in.

The children are excited to take part in the various activities in and around the school. In September the children appointed Energy Monitors for each class, where they ensure lights are switched off in classrooms and cloakrooms when they are not used and classrooms whiteboards, often forgotten by the teachers. The children







have made plans for a new Bug Hotel by he pond and have started bringing natural materials to make it 'cozy' for the new inhabitants.

<u>Curriculum Spotligh</u> Maths

Reception

In Reception we have been starting to write the numbers we know and exploring different Maths activities in our indoor and outdoor environments. During carpet sessions we have been learning to compare amounts using the language more and fewer and have also been making shape pictures and patterns during choosing time.





Year 1

In year 1 we have been focusing on Place Value. The children have been successfully able to find one more and one less of a given number. The children have been learning to count forwards and backwards and comparing amounts using the vocabulary fewer, less than and more than.

Year 2

In Maths, year 2 have been exploring place value. They have learned to reproduce 2-digit numbers up to 50 using dienes and other manipulatives to represent tens and ones. Their understanding of numbers up to 100 has been enhanced by partitioning and counting on number lines.





Year 3

In Year 3, we have been exploring place value. The children have learned to represent 3-digit numbers in a variety of ways and have especially enjoyed using counters to secure their understanding of hundreds, tens and ones. We have also begun using Chromebooks to enhance our Maths learning.

Year 4

In year 4, we have been focusing on the place value of numbers to 10,000. The children have been learning to order, compare and round numbers to 10,000.

Year 5

In Year 5 we have been focussing on the place value of numbers to a million. We have been ordering rounding and comparing these numbers. Our lessons include fluency, reasoning and problem solving and we have been learning how to explain our reasoning.

Year 6

In Maths, we have been focussing on Place Value and Negative Numbers. The children have also demonstrated their ability to compare and order numbers up to 10,000,000. Within lessons, we have been completing a range of activities including fluency, reasoning and problem-solving.



Berry Class

In Berry Class this half term, we have been focusing on place value to 100. Within that topic, we have explored numbers greater than and less than, counting forwards and backwards from 50 and understanding tens and ones.

urriculum Spotligh Reading

Reception

In Reception we have been reading the story 'Anna Hibiscus' Song'. We have enjoyed talking about the people who are part of our family and thinking about the similarities and differences between ours and Anna Hibiscus'. "I like reading stories like this." Arthur





Year 1

Year 1 have enjoyed reading the story 'The Little Red Hen'. We have been learning new vocabulary and discussing the different characters within the story. We also enjoyed acting out 'The Little Red Hen' which helped when writing speech bubbles in our English lesson.


Year 2

Year 2 have been learning about poetry; the features of a poem and how to perform a poem. We looked at the works of performance poets such as Benjamin Zephaniah and Michael Rosen. We focussed on the poem 'Don't' by Michael Rosen and discussed how repetition and rhyming is used.

Year 3

In Year 3, we have been reading Tchang and the Pearl Dragon. We have also been studying the book 'Jack's Fantastic Voyage'. We have been learning new vocabulary and discussing what it means. We also spoke about different verbs, nouns and adjectives we could use to describe different settings in the story.





Year 4

In Year 4, we have been looking at the story 'La Mariposa' where a child called Fransisco from Mexico starts a new school without knowing the language. We spoke about how the character must have been feeling and how this changed through the course of the book.

Year 5

In Year 5 we have been reading 'There's a Boy in the Girls' Bathroom'. The story is set in the USA and it deals with issues such as bullying, friendships and school life. It is also incredibly funny. We spoke about how the character felt at different points in the story and loved learning new vocabulary from the book.


Year 6

Year 6 have been reading about 'The Way of the Dodo' and discussed the impact humans had on the animals of Mauritius. We learnt why the dodo became extinct after humans arrived and found it interesting to learn how the discovery of the dodos' bones helped to change the image of the dodo.



Berry Class

In Berry class, the children have been studying the text 'The Colour Monster goes to School'. As part of their learning, the children have been identifying and acting out the different emotions explored in the story. They have also been talking about how different situations may make them feel.
